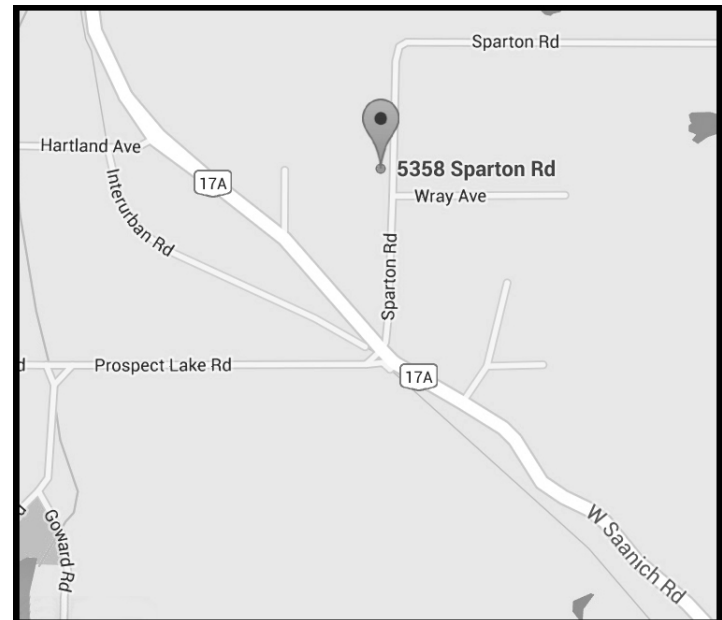
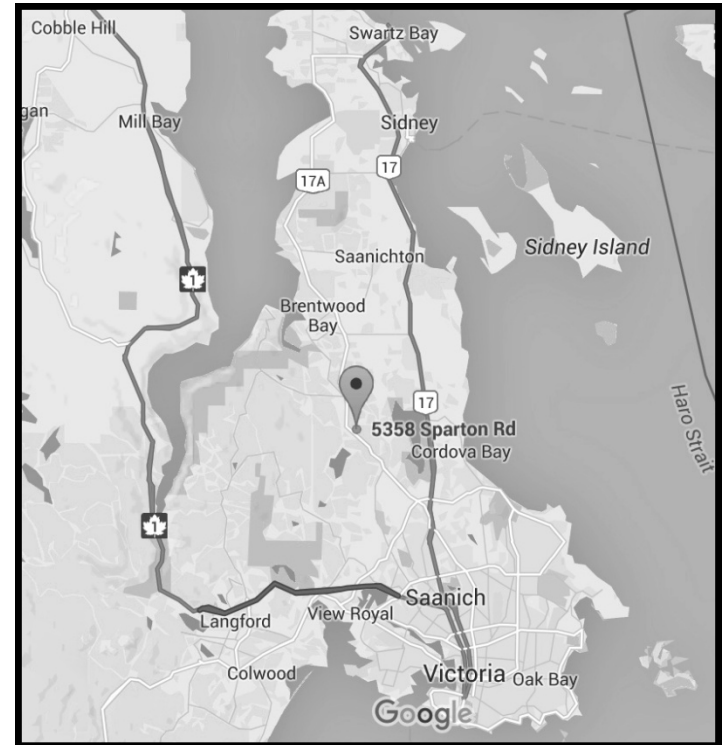

1. Flowers shall be shown in containers as supplied by the Society, except in basket, bowl and vase classes for which exhibitors shall provide their own containers. This Society will not be responsible for loss or damage to any container.
2. Exhibitors MUST show the name of every displayed exhibit on the entry tag, including the basket, bowl and vase classes.
3. Exhibits must have the Classification part of the entry tag completed. If help is needed, see any Senior Dahlia Judge.
4. All blooms exhibited must have been grown by the exhibitor.
5. Exhibitors may make as many entries as they desire in any class provided the entries are of different varieties, except for sections 51 & 52, where the number of entries is unlimited.
6. Points will be awarded in all classes except seedlings.
7. Judges may withhold awards when entries are deemed to be unworthy. Decisions of the judges shall be considered final. Judges must disqualify themselves from judging or influencing the judging in any classes where they have an interest. Complaints must be brought forward within 2 hours of judging completion.
8. To be eligible for a higher award, an exhibit must have won a first in its class. **If an exhibit has won in its class, and it was the only entry in that class, then it must receive a "Best of Type" ribbon (where applicable - Section 1 to 10) and also a Division Champ ribbon.**
9. Best Dahlia in Show will be selected from the best single entry in Sections 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, 11, 13, 15, 17, 19, 21, 23, 25, 27, 29, 31, 33, 35, and 37. Best Triple in Show will be selected from the best triple entry in Sections 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14, 16, 18, 20, 22, 24, 26, 28, 30, 32, 34, 36, and 38.

10. Entries placed in the wrong class as to colour or type may be properly placed and classified by the Judges Chair or a Senior Judge, but this must be done before judging of the section begins.
11. A vase is defined as a container having a diameter at the mouth less than the measure of its height.
12. A bowl is defined as a container having a diameter at the mouth at least equal to, but usually greater than, its height.
13. A basket is defined as a decorative container with a fixed handle.
14. Where the words “any foliage” appear in connection with a section or class, it signifies that foliage other than dahlia self-foliage may be used. Foliage may be used to enhance the decorative effect. Statice, gypsophylia or other minutely flowered plants (sometimes referred to as filler) may be considered as foliage.

15. CLASSIFICATION

- All entries are to be classified in accordance with the latest American Dahlia Society (ADS) Classification and Handbook of Dahlias in which it appears. Use the Pacific Northwest Supplemental Classification Listing (page 106 of the 2018 ADS Classification and Handbook) where applicable.

- Classification includes all of the following cultivar information:

Name	Type	Size	Colour
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- Classification information must be provided on the entry tags. The Exhibitor must know the name of the cultivar, or if it is a new cultivar not yet named, provide a code number.

16. EXHIBITOR DIVISIONS

OPEN: Experienced exhibitors, who have been consistent winners of head table and/or special awards during prior show seasons, are required to enter in this division. Exhibitors who have not consistently won head table and/or special awards during the immediate past three show seasons are encouraged to return to the Amateur Division. Entry Tags: **WHITE**

AMATEUR: This division is for knowledgeable exhibitors who show dahlias for fun and experience. Exhibitors in this division are encouraged to remain until they consistently win head table and/or special awards for three consecutive show seasons. Entry Tags: **YELLOW**

NOVICE: An exhibitor who is inexperienced in the showing of dahlias, and who may remain in this division for up to ten (10) ADS dahlia shows regardless of winnings. They will end the show season in the same exhibitor category as they started, instead of moving up mid-season. Entry Tags: **PINK**

JUNIOR: A person who is 16 years of age or under
Entry Tags: **BLUE**

SPECIAL CLASSES – Open to all Exhibitors
Entry Tags: **WHITE**

Exhibitors may elect to exhibit in a higher division, but then must place all their exhibits in those sections / classes. If two exhibitors are showing flowers grown in the same garden, then they both must show in the exhibitor division of the highest exhibitor (exception is Juniors will always show in Junior division).

17. MAKING ENTRIES: Exhibitors must use the appropriate entry tags available from the Show Secretary, or at the show in the staging area. Tags must be filled out completely and displayed with each exhibit.
18. UNDISSEMINATED CULTIVARS: These may be entered against classified cultivars in accordance with the 2018

ADS Classification and Handbook of Dahlias requirements (see page 9).

19. UN-CLASSIFIED ENTRIES: Any Senior Judge may classify blooms that are named and coded as to size, colour and type by initialling the entry's Show Tag. This also includes any seedlings with a numeric prefix followed by a name. But any entry with a wholly numeric identification name can be placed on an exhibit table without being signed off by a Senior Judge.
20. CONTAINERS: Exhibits should be staged only in containers supplied by the Society (Exception: members' own matching vases may be used). Bowls, baskets and materials are to be supplied by the exhibitor (see definitions).
21. FILLER: The filler for vases will be supplied.
22. FOLIAGE: In accordance with the ADS rule, the first pair of leaves must be attached and shown above the filler.

Proportion refers to the arrangement of blooms and foliage as related to each other and to the container.

Distinction refers to the overall effect of colour, harmony, artistic values of material, condition of basket and plant material, and overall neatness.

A Basket is a container with a handle, which may or may not be concealed according to the desired effect. Points should not be taken off if the handle is showing, unless the total effect is marred.

Vases and Bowl definitions can be found under General Rules at the beginning of the Catalogue.

Any foliage that is minutely flowered, such as statice, gypsophylia, etc., may be used in basket and bowl classes. The exhibitor should take care that the foliage and filler material is suitable and does not detract from the display of the blooms. Artificial supports are not allowed.

The Victoria Gladiolus Club started in 1946 and held annual shows in the Crystal Gardens. In 1951 or 1952 two Club members, Bill Kempster and Dorothy Eveleigh starting growing dahlias and exhibiting them in the Club shows which were then held in the Victoria Curling Rink. At about this time the Club changed its name to the Victoria Gladiolus and Dahlia Society. Over the years dahlias grew to become the dominant interest and in 2001 gladiolus was dropped from the club name.

In the 1950's, a number of club members started to hybridize dahlias and exhibit in shows in Oregon, Washington and BC. Dorothy Eveleigh and Bill Kempster's wife, Bea, were active in the Flower Arrangers Guild – hence the historical participation of flower arrangers in the Victoria Dahlia Society (VDS) show. Bea also did all the illustrations in the "Cook's Manual" which became the American Dahlia Society's official "Guide to Judging Dahlias".

Bill Kempster was also instrumental in the foundation of the Horticultural Center of the Pacific (now Glendale Gardens). He started a dahlia garden at the Horticultural Center which the Victoria Dahlia Society later took over. In 1994 it became the Victoria Dahlia Trial Garden, a sanctioned seedling dahlia garden of the American Dahlia Society.

The Pacific Northwest Dahlia Conference was suggested by Tony DeRooy who at the time the conference began lived in Everett, Washington. The conference was formed in 1954 and Victoria joined in 1968. Bill and Bea Kempster were the prime movers in joining.

Today the conference oversees the training and certification of judges & classifies any blooms that may grow to a different form, size or colour in the Pacific Northwest. Visit pndcdahlia.com for more information
